The British School, Rio de Janeiro is committed to safeguarding Personal Data. This Statement is addressed to parents and guardians of one or more



students in any unit (Botafogo, Barra or Urca) and concerns the processing of the following information:

Data updating and accuracy. You are solely responsible for the accuracy, correctness or



updating of the Data you provide to us. We are not obliged to process your Data if there are reasons to believe that such Processing could impute to us a violation of any applicable law, or if you are using our environments for any illegal or unlawful purposes.

1. What personal data do we process?

III. Authorization for Use of Image.

We may obtain personal data directly from you as the Responsible.

3. How we use your personal data?

Your Personal Data (and the data of any Student you are responsible for) shall only be processed if we have a specific purpose and legal basis for doing so. These purposes and bases are listed below.

4. Sharing of personal data with other organizations:

In order to effectively provide our education and learning services (including extracurricular activities), we sometimes need to share information with other organizations. We share information with the following companies:

The provision of data from those who send them directly, that is, depending on the case of the Parents, is a contractual requirement or a necessary requirement to enter into a contract. The provision of data is necessary to ensure the purpose of the processing - participation of a student in the recruitment process for the School and Parent data, in order to enable such process for admission to the school or to carry out arrangements with the school for those admitted

students. Failure to provide data shall make it impossible to fulfil the purpose of processing.

6. Consent.

When a student is under the age of 18, we shall obtain explicit consent from a student's parent/guardian on their behalf. This consent shall remain valid until withdrawn by the parent/guardian or the student, provided that:

The withdrawal of consent has no detrimental impact on the student's interests.

7. Transmission, storage and security of personal data.

Internet security

No data transmission over the Internet or via website can be guaranteed to be secure from intrusion. However, we maintain commercially reasonable physical, electronic and procedural safeguards to protect your Personal Data and the Personal Data of any Student under your responsibility always in accordance with legal data protection requirements.

All information that you, or any Student connected to you, provide to us is stored on our suppliers' secure servers and such information is accessed and used in accordance with our security policies and standards.

We ask that you or any student under your responsibility:

- (a) Refrain from sharing any password providing access to certain parts of our sites, applications or systems;
- (b) Comply with any other security procedures that we may notify you from time to time.

Storage Limits

We shall use Personal Data as long as necessary for the processing purpose(s) for which it was collected - educational process, archival and any other related purpose(s) permitted up to the time limit for claims.

Therefore, if Personal Data is used for two purposes, we shall retain it until the expiration of the purpose of the most recent term; but we shall stop using it for the purpose of the shorter term. We restrict access to Personal Data to individuals who need to use it for the relevant purpose(s).

Our retention terms are based on business needs and relevant laws, particularly as they relate to the specific retention terms that may apply to the school. Records that are no longer needed are irreversibly anonymized (and anonymous information may be withheld) or securely

8 - Rights relating to personal data.

Be aware of the rights that Data Subjects have in connection with their Personal Data.

Data Subjects have several rights related to the use of their personal. Be aware that certain exceptions apply to the exercise of these rights and therefore you may not be able to exercise such rights in all situations. If you wish to exercise any of these rights, we will verify your right and respond within a reasonable time.

Where applicable, parents shall have the following rights in connection with their personal data or the personal data of a student for whom they are responsible:

Subject Access: ▶ Gain access to any Personal Data held about you/a student for whom you are responsible. Generally, this information shall be provided within one month after the confirmation of your identity and understanding the scope of your request.

Withdrawal of Consent: Nithdraw any processing consents that you have given us or that have been given on your behalf and prevent further processing if there is no other reason, we can rely on to process your Personal Data. Withdrawal

of consent shall not affect the lawfulness of processing based on consent given before to its withdrawal.

Restriction: ▶ Require certain Personal Data to be marked as restricted in some circumstances, for example whilst we are resolving any complaints we may have received. Restriction means that although we will still store the data, we shall not process it until the restriction is lifted.

Prevent processing: ▶ Require the British School to stop any processing based on legitimate interests, unless the British School reasons for carrying out such processing outweigh any prejudice to your data protection rights.

Marketing: ▶ Require the British School to prevent the processing of your personal data for direct marketing purposes.

The use of Personal Data under the data protection laws of Brazil shall be justified under one of different legal basis and we are required to establish the legal basis in relation to each use of this policy.

The main legal basis justifying the use of your personal data are the following:

Consent: You have given your consent to the processing of such personal data for one or more specified purposes. You are free to withdraw your consent by contacting us. When you do this, we may not be able to provide any service that requires the use of such data.

Contract performance: If your information is needed to contemplate or perform our contract with you.

Legal Obligation: If we need to use your information to comply with our legal obligations.

Legitimate interests: If we use your information to pursue a legitimate interest and our reasons

for using it outweigh any prejudice to your data protection rights.

Legal claims: If your information is necessary for us to defend, prosecute or bring a claim against you, us or a third party.

These are the main legal basis that justify the use of special categories of your personal data, in the limited circumstances where it is necessary to do:

Explicit consent: You have given your explicit consent to the processing of this personal data for one or more specified purposes. You are free to withdraw your consent by contacting us. When you do this, we may not be able to provide a service that requires the use of such data.

Protection of your or another person's vital interests where you are unable to consent:

Processing is necessary to protect your vital interests or the vital interests from another individual where you are physically incapable to giving consent.

For legal proceedings: Processing is necessary to bring, exercise or defend legal claims or whenever tribunals are acting in their judicial capacity.

Substantial public interest: Processing is

necessary for reasons of substantial public interest, based on Brazilian or local law.

The following definitions are used in this Statement:

Data Controller: is the person who alone or jointly determines the purpose and means of processing Personal Data. The school is the data controller for all employment details used in its business.

Operator: is the company or professional directly responsible for data processing. Both the operator and the controller shall keep records about the data processing. The ANPD may request

these reports to verify if the procedures are in compliance with the law.

Personal Data: Is any information relating to an identified or identifiable individual. An identifiable individual is one who can be identified (directly or indirectly) by reference to an "identifier". These include names, identification numbers, location data, online identifiers or one or more specific factors to that individual's physical, psychological, genetic, mental, economic, cultural or social identity.

Special categories of personal data: This type of data is subject to more strict processing conditions than other Personal Data and includes Personal Data revealing racial or ethnic origin, political, religious or philosophical opinion and beliefs, trade union membership and genetic data processing, biometric data to uniquely identify an individual, or data about health, sex life, and sexual orientation. Health Data includes Personal Data relating to an individual's physical or mental health revealing information about the individual's health status.
